### Important Notes:

- Calculations are always rounded UP to the nearest 0.5 unit.  
(i.e. 12 units x 67% = 8.04, so it will be rounded up to 8.5)
- The Left column states the number of units you are attempting, *after* the drop deadline date.
- The Right column states the number of units you must complete with a 2.0 or above GPA.
- **Example 1:** Jamie attempts 12 units (must complete 8.5 units or more). She drops a 3-unit class with a “W” grade bringing her down to 9 units. She is still good because she is above the 8.5 unit requirement. As long as Jamie does not drop any more classes and passes her remaining classes with a 2.0 or above GPA, she will be on good standing.
- **Example 2:** Lisa attempts 9 units (must complete 6.5 units or more). She drops a 3-unit class with a “W” grade bringing her down to 6 units. She would be placed on Probation or Suspension for not completing 67% or more of her attempted units.
- **Example 3:** Richard attempts 13 units (must complete 9 units or more). Later on in the semester, he decides to add a 3-unit late-start class. Because his number of attempted units has increased, he will now be attempting 16 units, which means he must complete 11 units or more.
