Lang called the meeting to order at 11:03 a.m.

1. Approval of the December 3, 2021 agenda (action)

It was MSC by all present with no objections to approve the agenda as written.

2. Approval of the October 22, 2021 minutes (action)

It was MSC by all present with no objections to approve the minutes as written.

3. Public comment:

- Pieroni announced that CULN has submitted their four-year schedule and are working on their 21-22 assessments. He also questioned if actions plans should be created when setting up the assessment grid and White commented that it is highly recommended to do so.
- Weber commented that the general template is the default and asked if it could be changed. White will test in eLumen and follow up.

4. Announcements:

- White announced that Weber will be the SLOAC co-chair in spring 2022.

5. Business

- a. Plans for FLEX and next semester (discussion) – eLumen assessment training will be held on January 20 from 2:00 – 3:30 via Zoom and in person (ATC-108). SLOAC members are encouraged to inform their divisions/departments. The Instruction Office will provide an update on how many assessments were done during fall 2021.

White commented that next steps for the SLOAC include designing a review process for action plans. She added that eLumen will provide section data and not just course data that was provided in WebSLOs and the SLOAC will need best practices to compile and review data. Pieroni would like to see what the reports



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look like from eLumen and she what data is available. Moultrie added that eLumen has “beefed up” their assessment reporting and some data can be exported to Tableau.

- b. Meeting dates for Spring 2022 (decision)
 - i. 2/11, 2/25, 3/11, 3/25, 4/22
 - ii. 5/13 will be reserved and convene if needed
- c. Other questions regarding eLumen assessment (discussion)
 - i. Does every single section need to input a reflection? Strongly encouraged. Departments with courses that have a large amount of sections should discuss what their process should be. It will also rely on what the reports from eLumen look like and what information they provide.
 - ii. Where does the narrative go? When ready to complete the assessment click “Submit and Continue to reflection template.”
 - iii. Morgan noted that his department has many learning communities and options to their courses. Additionally, with recent changes in response to AB 705 there are some other assessment challenges.
 - iv. Lang commented that assessment anxiety has reduced in the past ten years and is looking forward to seeing how eLumen can foster more meaningful conversations.
 - v. Moultrie reminded the committee that assessments are not reflected in faculty evaluations. The evaluation process is overseen by UF and the UF contract. Additionally, all of the assessment results feed the program review process in eLumen.
 - vi. Weber questioned if there needs to be a separate document outside of eLumen to assist with data review and reflection. Lang commented that we will need to see what we get from eLumen.
 - vii. Orac expressed concern about PT faculty doing extra work. Lang reminded the committee that *administering* assessments is part of their professional responsibility.
 - viii. Melvin questioned if there was an update on accesses levels permissions in eLumen. Moultrie noted that she and White have been in discussion with eLumen on getting permissions changed for certain levels, noting that we cannot be the only college with this issue. Moultrie added that

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there may be a way to pay for the access levels to change and will follow up with eLumen in January.

Lang and White thanked the committee for their work this year and wished everyone a happy holiday season and a restful winter break.

Lang adjourned the meeting at 12:02 p.m.
