

Transfer FAQ

1. What are the services that Transfer Services offers?

We help you navigate all resources to browse universities and find colleges that work for you, like [Assist.org](#), to help you reach your transfer goals. We can help you with your applications to UC, CSU, Private and Out of State colleges. We also help students with TAG and TAP for UC's. We host college reps here at DVC for you to ask any and all of your transfer questions about each campus.

2. How do I transfer to DVC from another community college?

If you are interested in transferring to DVC from another college with credits from another college, you can find information on how to do so, including how to meet with a DVC counselor for a transcript evaluation from [DVC's enrollment](#) website.

3. What is Transfer Day?

[Transfer Day](#) is an annual event hosted in October. 60-80 different private and public university reps will be here to answer your questions and give advice about their schools and the transfer process. Check out our [Events & Workshops](#) page for details!

4. How do I make an appointment with a transfer college rep?

Schedule an appointment after viewing the [college rep visit schedule](#). While some reps are available for drop-ins, appointments are booked through the Career and Transfer Center. Please [book your appointment online](#) or drop by during our office hours.

5. Where can I find the requirements for out of state and private universities?

For other out of state and private universities, your best resource is the university's website. Most colleges have an admissions page with their requirements for transfer listed and a phone number for their admissions department. We also have information on certain [college's articulation agreements](#). If you'd like help researching, drop in!

6. What do I need to do to transfer to a UC/CSU

To get started on preparing for transfer, take a look at the [basic requirements](#) for transferring to a California public university.

7. Who can help me figure out which courses I need to take to transfer?

Schedule an appointment with a DVC counselor via the [DVC Counseling Office](#).

8. Who can help me plan to TAG to a UC campus?

Meet with a DVC counselor ASAP to review the TAG requirements for your specific UC campus and major.

9. How do I apply to a UC?

First, start and complete your [TAP](#) today. You can apply for the [Transfer Admission Guarantee](#) from your UC TAP between September 1st-30th. You can also use your TAP for the [UC application](#), opening on August 1st. Just be sure to submit your [UC Application](#) between November 1st-30th.

10. How do I apply to a CSU?

During your [application period](#), apply at [CalStateApply](#). And for any technical questions, use ["CSUMentor Online Application Instructions for Transfer Admission"](#)

11. When do I apply?

The application dates for applying can be found [here](#).

OR

Dates for UC's:

- i. When to start your TAP: ASAP or by September 1st.
- ii. When to apply to TAG: Fall Semester filing period is September 1st-30th.
- iii. When to begin your UC application: Website opens August 1st.
- iv. When to submit your UC application: Between November 1st-30th.

For a CSU to begin studies during:

- v. Fall semester or quarter: October 1st-November 30th
- vi. Winter quarter: If open, apply June 1st – 30th.
- vii. Spring semester or quarter: If open, apply August 1st-30th
- viii. Summer semester or quarter: If open, apply February 1st-28th.

12. When can I receive assistance with my college applications?

We will be hosting a series of application labs and workshops throughout the fall semester at different dates and times. You can [check these dates online](#) or drop in during our office hours.

13. What should I do after I applied?

After you apply, make sure to follow up on additional required steps:

- For UC applicants, check your emails! Also check [UC's timeline](#) of things to do after you've applied, including the January update.
- For CSU applicants, check your emails too! CSU campuses will be emailing you now and throughout the spring to request information or with important instructions for your next steps.

14. What is an Associate Degree for Transfer?

Students with an AA-T or AS-T receive admission priority and are guaranteed admission with junior status to one of the CSU campuses. Students who intend to transfer are advised to refer to the catalog of the prospective transfer institution and consult a counselor. This degree may not be the best option for students planning to transfer to certain CSU campuses or certain majors, or if they are applying outside of the CSU system, or if they are not planning to transfer.

15. How can I retrieve a DVC transcript, old class syllabus, or old DVC login?

- DVC transcripts can be retrieved through Admissions and Records or your Insite/WebAdvisor. Follow the [instructions](#) to do so on the Admissions & Records website.
