

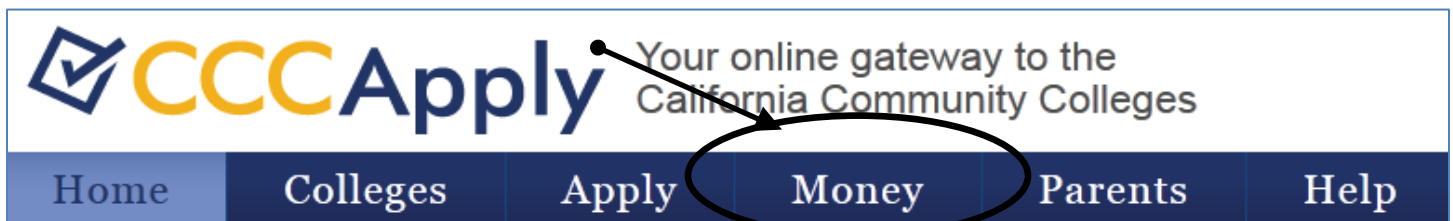
Financial Aid

How to Apply for the BOG Fee Waiver (California Residents Only)

The Board of Governor's (BOG) Fee Waiver is a California state program. The \$46 per unit cost of tuition at a California Community College is waived for students who meet the eligibility guidelines. Please note that eligible students are still responsible to cover the cost of the student union fees (max of \$10 per academic year) and the student activity fee (\$5 per semester). Applications are valid for one academic year and must be renewed every year starting in the Summer semester (Example: The 2014-2015 fee waiver application is valid for Summer '14, Fall '14, and Spring '15).

1) To apply, go to WWW.CCCAPPLY.ORG

2) Click "[MONEY](#)" at the top of the page



3) On the right hand side under "Apply for Financial Aid", click "[Step 3: Apply for BOG fee waiver](#)".

4) Read the information on the page and click "[Apply online for BOG fee waiver](#)" at the bottom of the page

5) Select the correct academic year for which you are applying

(Note: Summer term is the beginning of a new academic year for the fee waiver program at DVC)

6) Log on to CCCApply using the account information you used when you applied for the college or sign up for a new account if you do not already have one.

7) Fill out the entire application and submit.

If you need step-by-step assistance with the application, a financial aid staff member is available to assist you in the Enrollment Lab located on the first floor of the Student Services Building. Please contact the Financial Aid Office for the most up to date computer lab hours.

Please allow 48 hours for the Fee Waiver to be processed. You may check the status of your application by logging into your WebAdvisor/InSite Portal account under Financial Aid status by year.

The BOG fee waiver does not provide assistance for the cost of books, supplies, or other educational expenses. If you have not done so already, we highly encourage all students to complete the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid](#) (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov to determine whether you qualify for other types of financial aid.
